Minutes for November 16, 2014

The Southern Tier Orchid Society held its November meeting without the presence of our esteemed President, Linda Mandeville. She was enjoying a much needed break to spend time with family members via a long distance trip. Way to go, Linda! We missed your presence, but, having said that, we were privileged to have Mr. Bob Howe, Vice-President, conduct the meeting in your absence! At approximately 2:10 pm, Mr. Howe called the meeting to order, explained why he was taking Mrs. Mandeville's place. Last month's meeting minutes were approved and seconded.

Next Bob, asked Jane Trey, secretary, for a balance in our account. The treasury holds \$9,277.00. Old business was next. The members for officer candidates for the 2015 season are: President, Linda Mandeville, Vice President, Carol Vargason, for Secretary, Carol Brunnabend; Jane Trey for Treasurer and for the only vacant board member position, Anne Tinker Quain. We, the membership will vote our choices, at the beginning of our Holiday Party which will be held downstairs (parking lot entrance of the church) on Sunday, December 21st at 2:00 pm. Please come early with a "dish to pass" in hand and a willingness to help set up for the party. Next the membership was asked, by Paula Matienzo, if we want the information, about our show table orchids, to be printed monthly, in the newsletter, as it was in the past. A casual vote was taken and it was decided, that if members came with their orchid information, identified same on a sheet of paper on the table, it would indeed be part of the newsletter. Those members who brought orchids for viewing were: Bob R, John Z, Carol V, Dave C, Donna C and Dawna C.

We next took a break and enjoyed the goodies brought by many of our thoughtful members. Thank You!!!

At about 2:20 pm, Vice President Howe, brought the meeting back to order. At that time he introduced our guest speaker, Ms. Isabel Lopatin hails from Cold Springs, New York. She is a member of the Mid Hudson Orchid Society, Vice President of Glinwood, and a former Binghamton University graduate. Ms. Lopatin presented a very entertaining and informative slide presentation entitled: "Gleaning Hints from Orchid Morphology". Ms. Lopatin reminded us that the outward appearance of an orchid can tell you about its needs! Our presenter touched on Sympodial and Monopodial orchids.

Sympodial orchids have many growing points. As she was showing slides of particular orchids, she talked about its` features. Sympodial orchids need to be fertilized all the way around the roots. If a plant does not have pseudo bulbs, it needs to be watered more frequently. A phal needs low light and a vanda needs high lights. If your plant sends out more roots, it needs more water.

Monopodial orchids push up from one growing point. A classic example is a phal. It needs moisture and lets you know that. Monopodials have multiple growths. Canes bloom only from the leaf apex. Canes produce "keikes".

Ms. Lopatin posed a question: "Which came first in terms of evolution, the sympodial or monopodial orchid?" After no member volunteered an answer, Isabel said, she was going to research further, when she could......and "stay tuned" for an answer...from somewhere. Next, our presenter asked her audience, what are leaves for? Of course several murmured, to convert sunlight into food. It was noted that the more surface a plant has, the more photosynthesis it can perform. Orchid leaves van be thick, thin, flat pleated, thick, pliable, or cylindrical. Deciduous orchids all have thin leaves. Dendrobium Onosmum should not be watered when blooming. It was noted that orchid roots are covered with velamen.

Our presenter asked if we had comments or questions. Mr. Howe led a round of applause while he thanked Isabel for coming.

Our meeting was concluded about 3:40 pm.
