 - Seedlings are cheaper to purchase but must rely on photos of anticipated plants.
 - Divisions of plants are less expensive.
 - Blooming orchids sell for more.
 - o It often takes a while for orchids to acclimate to your home.


Psychopsis Memoria Bill Carter. Likes shade to dappled light, warm to hot. It is a hybrid.


