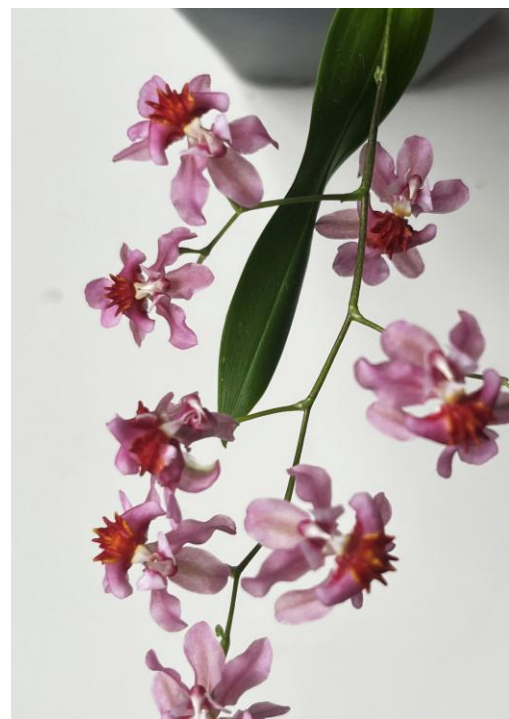

A peloric orchid is a type of orchid that exhibits a mutation resulting in a change in the symmetry of its flowers, often making them appear more radially symmetrical than the typical bilateral symmetry of most orchids. This mutation can cause petals to resemble the lip (labellum) of the orchid, or can result in other unusual floral characteristics. Sometimes the flowers don't fully open.

The term "peloric" comes from the Greek word "pelōros," meaning monstrous or extraordinary. It is not a disease and many peloric flowers are truly extraordinary.

Pelorism is often found in *Phalaenopsis*, and also in the *Cattleya* Alliance, *Vanda* Alliance and even some *Dendrobiums*.

(*besseae* x *sargentianum* )

Mrs. Elizabeth Besse, a member of an orchid collecting party from the Selby Botanic Gardens (Florida), was the first to find *Phrag. besseae* in the wild in 1981. Apparently, she found it by accident while answering a call of nature!

It was growing in semi-shade on wet granite rocks at an altitude of 1100m in Peru. Subsequently other colonies of the species were found further north in Ecuador, again growing on wet granite rocks at altitudes of 1000-1200m. It is never found in large numbers but the brilliant red color of its flowers makes it difficult to miss when in bloom.

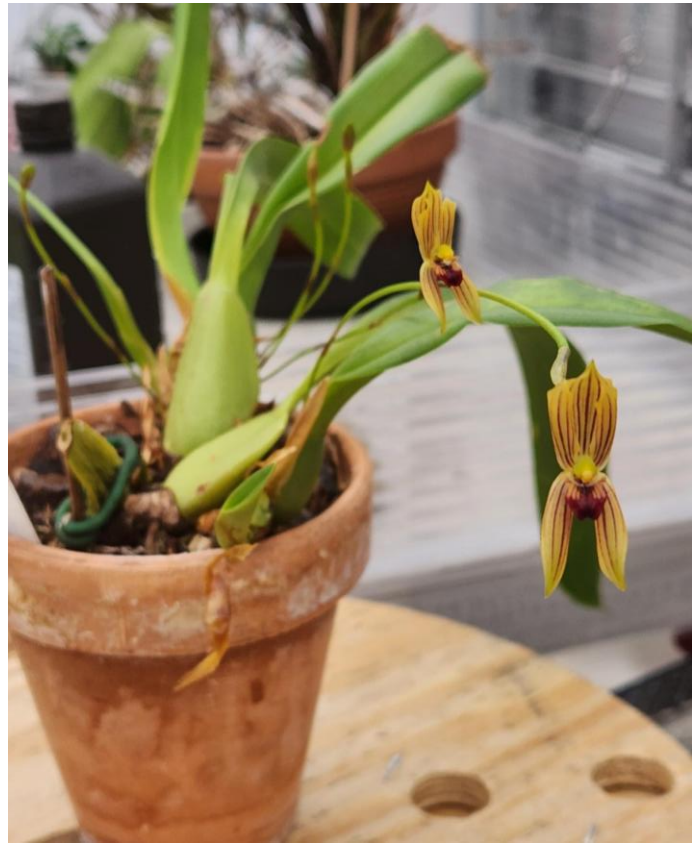

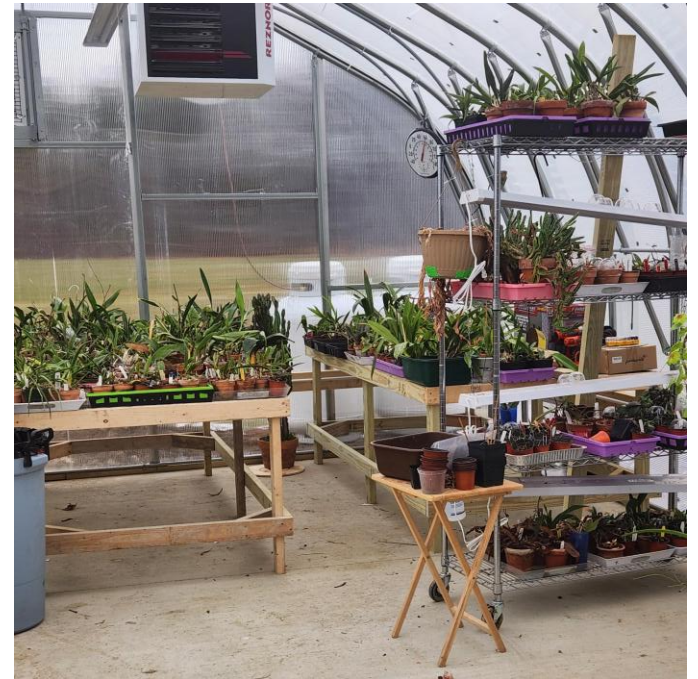
